

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-22-F

RESOLUTION REQUESTING INFORMATION FROM COUNTY AUDITOR FOR PURPOSES OF EVALUATING AND LEVYING A TAX EXCEEDING THE 10-MILL LIMITATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village Council has preliminarily determined that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the 10-mill limitation will be insufficient to fund necessary services provided by the Village of Greenhills, Hamilton County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose and intent of such funding is for current operating expenses for the Village as authorized by Section 5705.19 (A) of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, ORC Section 5705.03 requires the Village Council to obtain certain information from the County Auditor prior to proceeding with the submission of a tax levy to the electors of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Greenhills, Hamilton County, Ohio, 6 members thereto concurring.

SECTION 1.

The Village Council has preliminarily determined that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the 10-mil limitation for the benefit of the residents of Greenhills for current operating expenses for the Village as authorized by Section 5705.19 (A) of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 2.

The levy to be placed upon the tax list is a renewal levy.

SECTION 3.

The Village Council hereby requests information from the County Auditor related to the current total tax valuation of the Village and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by a levy of tax at a rate not exceeding 3.28 mills for each One Dollar (\$1) valuation.

Section 4.

The Clerk of the Village Council is hereby directed to immediately certify to the County Auditor this Resolution and to obtain from the County Auditor the information requested hereunder.

SECTION 5.

This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare. The reason for said emergency is to have the necessary information available for the Village Council to enable it to put the tax levy on the November 2011 ballot.
